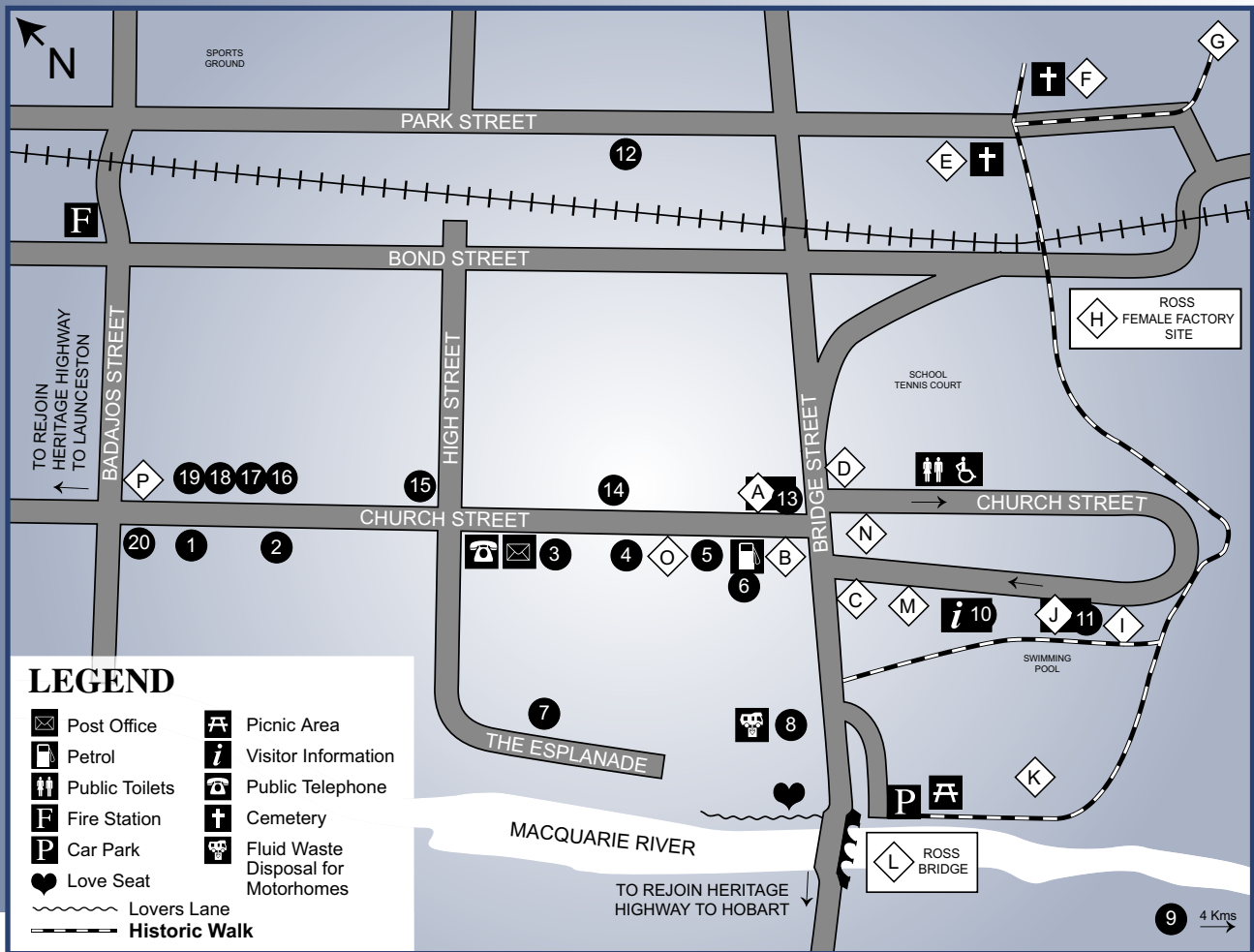


ROSS
